

2019-20 access and participation plan monitoring Provider impact report

This impact report summarises the progress made by The Trafford College Group against targets, objectives and written commitments set out in its 2019-20 access and participation plan. This document is a summary of information submitted by the provider to the OfS. This document is a self-report by the provider only and does not indicate any OfS assessment of compliance.

1. Ambition and strategy

The Trafford College Group's ambition and strategy as detailed in the 2019-20 access and participation plan:

The college celebrates the diversity of its higher education provision and this is reflected in the demographic of our student body. Our HE students are predominately mature, with non-traditional entry qualifications and often working or with caring responsibilities. Additionally, the majority of students are consistently drawn from areas of low participation in higher education and a large proportion of students are also drawn from areas of low income. Our ethnic profile of students largely mirrors our local and regional community and 22% of students declare a disability.

Our Access and Participation ambitions for 2019-20 set out how we would improve the educational experience where access and participation highlights gaps between those from the most and least advantaged backgrounds. We created a series of 9 ambition targets to eliminate such gaps where these exist.

Access

- Increase the participation rate of care leavers
- Increase the participation of young people from underrepresented groups
- Increase internal progression from further education
- Increase the participation rates of BME students

Success

- Increase the success of BME students
- Increase the continuation and achievement rates of students with disabilities
- Increase the continuation rate of students from low income backgrounds
- Increase the success of students from low participation neighbourhoods

Progression

Increase the proportion of students progressing to highly skilled employment

Annex A: Commentary on progress against targets

The Trafford College Group's commentary where progress against targets was less than expected.

Target reference number: T16a 01

How have you met the commitments in your plan related to this target?

We did not achieve our strategic target set out in this plan in relation to the increase of care leavers in higher education. While we are confidence we have care leavers within our HE provision, there is a clear reluctance for students to self declare; this is an area of development. We met our commitments in fostering new relationships with our local authorities and held 2 events; one with care leavers themselves and another with key agents to enhance their knowledge of higher education and supporting students in HE. We had further followed up sessions scheduled for 2019-20 however these were cancelled due to covid-19 and moved to remote, but engagement was low. Although we did not meet our target commitment in terms of access, a number of care leavers that attended our events have commenced studying in FE within the College as a starting point. It is hoped that we can now support these learners with transition to HE.

Have you taken any additional steps other than that detailed in the plan to reach the selected milestone?

We have not taken any additional steps during 2019-20

How have you met the commitments in your plan related to this target?

We did not achieve the target of '175' part time students. However overall recruitment for both full and part time were less than expected in 2019-20. Despite the recruitment challenges part time students represent 34% of our total new entrance for 2019-20 against the national indicator of 18%. We have also seen an increased number of students from low participation neighbourhoods and IMD accessing our part time provision. The committment within the plan was to "continue to provide an accessible offer for part time students. 72% of all current higher education students are mature, our ambition is to maintain or exceed the proportion of students who are 21 years old or older" we achieved this committment in 2019-20 highlighting a change of +2% from 2018-19 to 2019-20 and +7% change between 2015-16 and 2019-20.
